



## Norwich Gourmet Food Itinerary

Follow our foodie walking tour through the heart of the medieval city of Norwich. Mix delicious Norfolk ingredients with historic buildings, pretty winding alleys and back streets to discover a wealth of wonderful food experiences and a host of eating places you can enjoy again and again.

### Itinerary

Begin your itinerary with a slice of delicious cake and a coffee in **Louis Deli**. Mid morning the deli is brimming with local produce goodies from meat and homemade bread to pasties, cakes and biscuits.

Walk towards the Guildhall and enter The Norwich Lanes via Lower Goat Lane. Drop in at **Clark and Ravenscroft** for a mooch around their smoked fish, cured meats, East Anglian cheeses. Treat yourself to homemade pate, pesto or a tartlet.

Continue on within The Lanes to St Benedicts Street where you will come across **Kitchen** a small cafe/bistro showcasing Norfolk on a plate. The menu reflects the seasons with organic wines, beers and soft drinks to complement.

Almost next door you will see **St Benedicts** restaurant one of 4 city restaurants owned by Jayne and Nigel Raffles. All 4 restaurants use fresh local produce and change their menus regularly to reflect this.

Venture over towards the Cathedral Quarter of Norwich to find **Expresso** one of Norwich's favourite independent cafés, renowned for its hearty toasted ciabattas, scrumptious home-made cakes and great coffee. A buzzing meeting place where local artists showcase their work, Expresso is open all day, every day, with additional outside seating available in their secret courtyard.

Heading towards the Cathedral to Elm Hill stop at **The Britons Arms Coffee House and Restaurant**, a 15<sup>th</sup> century thatched building located in the heart of medieval, Elm Hill. This family run business with an excellent reputation for good food was opened in 1951 and sees many generations of local people through its doors time and time again. The cooking is traditional using local foodstuffs and seasonal ingredients.

Wander down Elm Hill and turn right – you will find yourself opposite Norwich Cathedral. Take some time looking around the Cathedral and its cloisters, if you're a keen photographer this is a great place to capture a stunning shot. The **Cathedral Refectory** restaurant sits in the shadow of Norwich Cathedral spire – the second tallest in the country.

Head back towards the city centre walking through Tombland and down London Street. Here you will arrive at **Jarrolds Department Store** the only independent department Store in Norwich established in 1823. Go down to the basement and you will discover a corner filled with deli products and local produce. Try a huge slice of their chicken pie made fresh on the premises.

Come out of Jarrolds onto Gentleman's Walk and opposite you will see the resplendent **Norwich Market** located beneath Norwich City Hall and Norwich Castle. This market is the largest 6 day-a-week open air market in the country. The market has been on this site longer than any of the buildings that surround it - more than 900 years. Luckily the food is much fresher! Today you will find local fish, bread, cheese, jams and meat amongst all the usual market stalls that you would expect.

From the market go into the Royal Arcade once the yard to the Royal Hotel coaching inn built in 1899 with art nouveau styling by local architect George Skipper. Here you will find the worlds only **Colman's Mustard Shop** and Museum. Sample some mustard and buy a range of Colman's products including souvenir jars.

Finally head up Gentleman's Walk, turn right at Starbucks (no city is complete without one!) and walk towards The Forum. On the left of the Forum cross over Theatre Street and ahead will be Chapelfield Plain where **Mackintosh's Canteen** is located. Mackintosh's Canteen is a vibrant café and brasserie split over 2 floors. Their ethos is simplicity - the food produced is simple, fresh and made using locally sourced ingredients. The menu changes seasonally and caters for many different tastes. Mackintosh's is one of 4 locally owned restaurants by entrepreneur Henry Watt.
